## The Ultimate Sacrifice - WWII Historical Writing

**A)** In the country of Belgium during the winter of 1944, a major battle occurred called the **Battle of the Bulge**. The German army launched a surprise attack, surrounding the U.S. Army in Bastogne. When the German army told the Americans to surrender, a determined General McAuliffe replied: "NUTS!" After a month of battle 19,000 Americans were killed with 47,000 wounded, but the defense was successful and helped win the battle. It was the largest and bloodiest American battle in WWII.

**B)** Although Japan is a good friend of America today, during WWII its military committed great atrocities against Asian countries and American troops. The **Bataan Death March** was a 60-mile forced prisoner march. Japanese captors starved, tortured, mutilated, and killed American and Filipino prisoners along the journey. It is estimated 10,000 of the 80,000 prisoners did not survive the march.

**C)** On June 6, 1944 **D-Day** became the turning point of WWII for America and its allies, when 160,000 troops crossed into Normandy, France. The cost of the invasion was high with 4,414 Americans killed in one day. The first wave of Americans were told to carry extra ammunition, so when they were hit other soldiers could carry the supplies forward. A special cemetery was created for the soldiers near the invasion site.
