


## Across

- 1. Area where land meets the sea or ocean.

- 8. A rocky pool separated from the sea at low tide, filled with seawater.

- 12. A body of water confined to a relatively narrow but long region.
- 13. Coastal upland regularly flooded by the tides.
- 15. A recessed, coastal body of water connected to an ocean or lake.
- 16. A piece of land bordered by water on three sides but connected to mainland.
